The objectives of these Multiplier Events

- Encourage direct exchange between the local players present and the European players.
- Encourage future collaboration.

Results

This event took place on the afternoon of 8 October 2024 at the Landes CCI in Dax. The MDE40 WIPSEE had invited a large audience to disseminate the results of the project to as many people as possible. Local players were present to represent their organisations, as well as political representatives from the department and young people interested in the subject. The project's European partners were also present, as we wanted to facilitate direct exchanges.

It was a convivial moment, full of sharing. Part of the afternoon was devoted to presenting the project, the SDGs and HE at European level, and the vital role of young people and youth workers. This moment of introduction and presentation was essential for understanding the context of the YESSS project. As the event was the last to be held, we were able to present all the results of the project: the tools made available to youth workers to increase their knowledge of the SDGs and SE (website, activity booklet, training, digital guide, etc.); the resources for understanding the complexity of these themes at European and international level; and finally the tools for encouraging young people to take ownership of SE and create their own sustainable and social project (self-assessment tests on the SDGs and SE).

The afternoon ended with a time for questions and answers and for sharing experiences between the European partners and the participants in the event. We were able to compare our learning methods and the obstacles encountered in working with young people. It was a real opportunity to share experiences, and one that gave rise to a desire to continue with future joint projects.



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
